



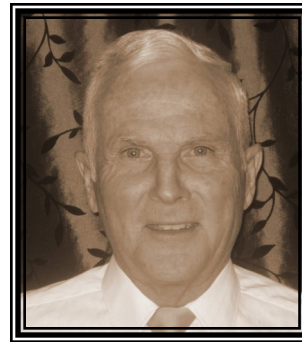
WHO SHOULD BE ON THE WALL OF HONOUR?

SELECTION CRITERIA

- Individuals, organizations, or businesses who have made significant contributions or donations to the preservation of history in South Simcoe County or Museum on the Boyne.
- Those who have contributed significant volunteerism over a period of time at the Museum on the Boyne or to South Simcoe County history.
- Those who display, sustain, and exercise leadership in heritage preservation.
- Those who demonstrate vision, innovation or creativity in the presentation and learning from artifacts of our past.
- Those who enrich and improve the quality of life in South Simcoe through the sharing of historical knowledge.
- Those who promote and support the expansion of heritage opportunities in our community and Museum on the Boyne.
- Those who have been nominated in the past but have not received a Museum on the Boyne Wall of Honour Award.

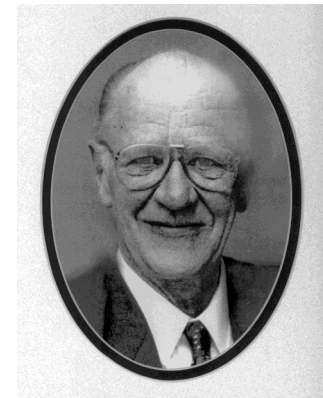
THE PROCESS

1. Nominations are open. Nominations can be made for individuals, organizations or businesses.
2. A nominee maybe re-nominated over several years but can only receive a Wall of Honour Award once. Should a nominator wish to use a past nomination application they may request to do so in writing to Museum on the Boyne staff or Advisory Committee.
3. The nominator completes the nomination form and assembles all of the required materials as part of the nomination package.
5. All Nominations must be received at the Museum on the Boyne annually by 4:00pm on December 22nd each year. No exceptions will be made.
6. Museum staff may choose to verify nomination information. The Museum on the Boyne Advisory Committee will review nominations and final selection will be made in the Spring.
7. The Wall of Honour ceremony will be held on the first Saturday during May is Museum Month.
8. Notification of the ceremony and the name of the award recipient(s) will be published in the local media.
9. If selected, the nominee must provide a 5 x 7 photograph, additional information (if requested) and a list of invitees for the ceremony.



NOMINATION REQUIREMENTS:

1. One completed **nomination form** (See attached).
2. Nomination forms must be accompanied by a **statement of nomination**: a maximum of one page which describes the nominee's merits. Make sure to relate the relevant points of background, education, training, volunteerism, activity and organizational involvement, other recognitions and awards, achievements and contributions to our heritage community.
3. **Letters of support** are encouraged. A maximum of three letters will be accepted.
