TOWN COUNCIL OPPORTUNITIES FOR ASSISTANCE RE: Needs FOR 2020

1. Public Washrooms

Public washrooms are needed in the downtown core to promote a comfortable and welcoming atmosphere to shop in Alliston.

2. Bicycle Racks

Bicycle racks are needed in the downtown core to encourage residents to ride downtown and leave the car at home. This will help reduce issues with parking in our core.

3. Official By-Pass Re: Industrial Parkway

Working with Ontario Government to make by-pass official to reduce traffic through the downtown core. Large trucks, dump trucks that are noisy, hard on roads and intimidating to pedestrians can be diverted from the downtown core by using the allotted by-pass already in place.

4. Additional lighting poles

Lighting poles are a great way to brighten the downtown, and along with the addition of banners and flowers help to beautify our downtown.

5. Additional By-law officers

We need the presence of By-law officers in the downtown to ensure by-laws are being enforced and deter further infractions.

6. Riverfront Project

Building up our riverfront will draw tourism, encourage visitors to walk downtown and elevate our welcoming climate downtown.

7. Sidewalk Repairs

For safety, insurance as well as simple esthetics our sidewalks are in immediate need of repair.

8. Walkways to go back

Access from public parking up to Victoria Street is an absolute necessity and the current walkways (blocked staircase E of Paris North Street) need to be easily accessible.
