Moments in History

The Beeton Town Hall is a beautiful building with spectacular architectural features and has stood out as the crown jewel of the downtown core since 1894.

The Town Hall was tendered to Arthur Goldsmith in 1894 for the price of \$3,500. Bricks were supplied by the Bemrose Brick Yard which was located north of Beeton. The new Town Hall officially opened February 15th 1895.

Since its beginning, the Town Hall was the centre of the community. It housed Council chambers, an auditorium, the fire hall and a jail. A large room in the back was used for a weekly farmer's market. The Town Hall was closed in 1946 and purchased by the Cooper-Weeks company (later Cooper Canada Ltd.). York-Simcoe Printing occupied the building for decades and today it is now housing the Bee Town Medical Centre.
